Note to VMS Users

When reading older VMS format files, IDL knows that all floating-point values are in VAX format. These floating values are automatically converted to IEEE format. Only VMS/IDL is able to restore the native VMS format.

Note - If you are restoring a file created with VAX IDL version 1, you must restore on a machine running VMS.

Given the above, and assuming you still have a VAX, you could restore and then resave in the new format. If you don't have a VAX I would say you need to ask the RSI folks.
