I have now identified certain regions in this data array that I want to remove, and i want to regrid this data array by interpolating so that the regions that I have removed from the data array are filled with values from its neighboring regions. How do I go about doing this? What value should I give to the identified regions, so as to remove it from the final regridded array.

I guess I am falling in trouble because I have already set a missing value to certain parts of this data array(during trigrid).
