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It is possible to handle data larger than 270 MB. I don't know about windows, but under Unix, you often have to deal with process memory limits. If you have Unix, check out the "limit" or "ulimit" command, and use it to set your datasize to a large number, or "unlimited", before running IDL.

ENVI should open this size of file - I am currently working on MASTER data that is delivered as 800MB+ HDF files and I can open it fine in both ENVI and IDL. Make sure your "Memory Usage" settings in ENVI are set up correctly, and that you have the latest service packs installed. Cheers.
