I've run IDL 5.4 (and 5.5b) on W2000(fresh install) since Jan . Like all versions of windows-IDL I am used to occasional crashes - most seem to initiate from clicking in the IDE, a very few while code runs. I just thought this was as good as you could hope for with Win-IDL I run some montecarlo batch jobs which take upto 7 days and never get crashes then - so I suspect the IDE event handler in my case.
