- > returning graphics.
- > It works fine when I run it from the command line, but idl doesn't do a
- > thing under the server.
- > Anyone has an idea?

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- > The differences I could tell are:
- > different environment variables (no IDL_PATH, IDL_DIR)
- > different user/group (nobody/nobody).

When you execute the script

(1) Does IDL even start up? You may need to explicitly set up the IDL environment in the script, e.g.

source /usr/local/rsi/idl/bin/idl setup

or

- . /usr/local/rsi/idl/bin/idl_setup.ksh
- (2) Is an X client available when the script runs? If your IDL code is creating graphics and you are not using the Z-buffer, then an X-client must be available in order for graphics windows to be created. This is why people often use the Z-buffer instead of graphics windows when running scripts that call IDL in the background.

I recommend trying a very small IDL test program first to make sure your setup is working. For example, create a plot, and save it to a JPEG file.
