> possible after hacking through rdpix.pro, but I can't figure out how
> to do it :(

If you search the Google IDL newsgroup archives with something like "overwrite current line print", you will probably come up with a couple of methods.

You can also change the text on my progress bar, which gives the folks something interesting to watch besides text:

```
progressbar -> Update, percent, Text='Processing data set 1'  
progressbar -> Update, 2*percent, Text='Processing data set 2'
```
