- > 2. I see that with ICONTOUR, one can control the C_LABEL_INTERVAL.
- Is it possible to do the same thing but with the "direct graph"
- > not the "object" oriented one?

By the way, I forgot to say that I am using IDL 6.0 on a Red Hat 8.0 linux with 128 Mb of RAM (a 650 MHz CPU). I don't know if this has to do with the error but in case it can help trace the origin of the error.
