Purpose of this ftp site

This ftp site contains the JHU/APL/S1R IDL library.

Widget tools, Library maintenance and documentation, and Miscellaneous.

Accessing the ftp site

By a web browser: <ftp://fermi.jhuapl.edu/pub/idl/>

By ftp (Make sure you use ftp, not telnet):

ftp fermi.jhuapl.edu

For Name type: anonymous

For Password enter: your email address (ex: sterner@tesla.jhuapl.edu).

Change directory by entering: cd pub/idl

Set the correct transfer type: ascii (for README, cat.one, doc_guide.txt)
or binary (for the *.Z files).

To get a file enter: get filename

When finished enter: bye.

Get the ascii file README (4k byte) for a guide to this ftp site.

You may also want to get the one line description file cat.one (51kb).

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David - I had the same problem reading PDF files with Acroread 4.0 (that is, getting a blank screen when the browser opened some PDFs, while others were okay). When I upgraded to Acroread 6.0 this problem went away, so my best guess is that it has to do with some compatibility issue between newer PDFs and the older Acroread.
