One could get a better newsreader (for example I probably will switch to Mozilla for newsgroups, I already use it for email and webbrowsing.)

My only suggestion would be the creation of some rules, which could work since this newsgroup is so tightly knit. But I'm starting to think it is probably a bad idea to try to get the IDL community to agree on rules, let alone have everybody follow it.

Offhand I don't see how to filter crossposted messages in outlook express or in Mozilla. I'll check out free agent and some others to see if that is possible.
