dialog_pickfile does nothing else than returning a string which contains a filename, including the path. That string can then be passed as an argument to openr, openw and any other function / procedure which does something with a file.

Anyway, you don't write to a directory, you write to a file. And to specify the file in IDL, you use a text string. The text string can include an absolute path, or a path relative to the current working directory (which you can find out by doing

IDL> cd, current=current_dir & print, current_dir
).
