I did an archive + install, not an upgrade so I got the latest X11 (v1.1).

I could try downgrading, or maybe if I decide to upgrade another computer before this is fixed I will keep the X11 that comes with 10.3 (v1.0 I presume?). That should help isolate the problem.

FYI, there is another 10.4 + X11 problem that a lot of people are experiencing: X11 no longer moves to the foreground when you CMD+Tab to it from another application. It gets the keyboard focus, but it

does not raise. Sort of like my old \*nix boxes used to behave. If you click 2x on the Dock icon then it comes to the front.

I have the exact same problem here...

I installed Tiger as an update on 10.3.9 and specified to install X11 in the Tiger installer. I also installed the X11 SDK along with XCode.

I confirm that the CURSOR procedure is somewhat broken... I can get a CURSOR output by closing the plotting window but the cursor position output seems to be erroneous moreover the window is closed, so it is not very useful...

I also confirm that the widget windows do get focus and are working perfectly.
