> float tmpv;
>

> tmpv = (float)(*pf);
>
> convert the variable from a 4 elements byte array to a float point
> variable in IDL?

Try this:

```
byta = [103B, 38B, 18B, 68B]  
var = Float(byta, 0)
```

You need the offset (the second positional parameter), as
I just learned again this morning to my chagrin. :-(
