The file needs to be relative to your working directory in order for this to work. Even if you have your file in the same directory as the the source code, paths are resolved according to your working directory.

You can see your current working directory with IDL> cd, CURRENT=current IDL> print, current

It is this directory that's being added to the front of the filename. For example, if the current directory were "/my/current/directory", the file that you're attempting to open is actually "/my/current/directory/filename.img" and probably not what you want.
