- > I've been creating a number of plots with the properties
- > [XY]TICKLEN = 1.0
- > and
- > [XY]GRIDSTYLE = 1 ! Dotted gridlines

- > I'm plotting the mean and stddev of a bunch of numbers in separate sets of plots on the
- > same page (via the position keyword) and I've noticed that on-screen (and in PS output
- > also) the spacing between the dots of the yaxis (horizontal) gridlines is much smaller for
- > the first plot than for the second. The xaxis (vertical) gridlines appear fine throughout.
- > I'm plotting four sets of two plots per page, and it's always the upper (first) plot of
- > each set that has this weirdness.

>

- > Has anyone experienced this before? It's not a showstopper but it makes the output look
- > even untidier that it already is (the plots are quite busy).
