Some entries could be brought more up to date and I would appreciate submissions that could be used for this purpose from users that work in areas covered by the FAQ. Such page references will help keep the FAQ size from growing too quickly.

If you are not familiar with the WWW or WWW browsers you are missing a lot and should try to obtain the needed software. A number of browsers are available free. NCSA (National Center for Supercomputing Applications) mosaic may be obtained from the anonymous ftp site

It is available for Unix workstations, PC Windows, and Macs. The one requirement is a good connection to the internet.

Netscape is another good web browser (that's what I use) and may be picked up from the net also.
