The "workspace" is just a folder where (in theory) all of your IDL projects are going to live. I say "in theory" because it is possible to create projects that live outside your workspace folder, but knowledge of those projects is going to remain in the workspace folder (in the .metadata folder that gets created in your workspace. You should put this, I think, on a local disk.

You can then easily create a project in your workspace. Once you have the project folder set up, just right-click the project and choose the Import selection. You can import (copy) files from wherever you like into the project folder.
