I've figured out the problem. Line 77 showed this:  
READS, date, juldate, FORMAT=\$  
'( C(CYI4, 1X, CMOI02, 1X, CDI02, 1X, CHI02, 1X, CMI02, 1X, CSF06.3) )'

but the date variable was a null string. That is what caused the 'end of file unit' error. As for the "Network is unreachable", I have no idea why that came up.
