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And another question: I have the idlwave shell running in a dedicated frame. However, when I hit an error or a stop, emacs will split the dedicated frame (showing me the error in both the split frame and in the original source), AND opens a new frame with a mirror of the command line.

I can only assume this happens because I have some redundancy between the dedicated frame and something else, but closing two windows every time I need to debug is a serious draw on my morale. Any suggestions as to what I've done wrong here?
