- > By default the IDL Workbench is iconized when you start ENVI+IDL. If
- > this is the case, you can change that behavior by editing the <blah>
- > \ITT\IDL71\idlde\idlde.ini file and removing the line that says "-
- > minimized", if I remember correctly.

- > If you are seeing ENVI but not Workbench at all (iconized or not),
- > then you are using a runtime ENVI license, not a full license.
- >
- > Installing ENVI after you have already installed IDL should not, as
- > far as I recall, be an issue. Is your ENVI+IDL shortcut pointing at
- > "<blah>\ITT\IDL71\idlde\envi_idl.exe"?
