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Hi all,

This is a variation on the 2D matching problem that I'm having trouble algorithm-ing (to coin an incredibly awkward word).

I have two sets of XY coordinates of unequal length (i.e., $x_1/y_1/n_1$, $x_2/y_2/n_2$, $n_1 \neq n_2$). I want to find offsets in both X and Y that match the two sets as closely as possible (there will obviously be some unmatched coordinates in the larger set). I'm just looking for constant offsets, so basically (for $n_1 < n_2$) $x_1 + C_x \rightarrow x_2$, $y_1 + C_y \rightarrow y_2$, with some elements of x_2 and y_2 being unmatched. How do I go about doing this? I don't think I can use JD's MATCH_2D because I don't know a priori what my matching radius is.
