> Standard IDL syntax is to have an object "foo" in a file called
> "foo__define.pro" that contains, perhaps, something like this:
>
> PRO foo__define, class
>   class = { foo:42, bar:"baz" }
> END
>
> And then to instantiate said object like this:
> IDL> f = obj_new('foo')
>
> =====
>
> Would it be simpler, and does anyone see any negatives, to the
> following setup:
>
> 1) Rename the file from "foo__define.pro" to "foo.pro"
> 2) Keep the contents exactly as before
> 3) Append the following to the bottom:
>
> FUNCTION foo, _EXTRA=e
>   return, obj_new('foo', _EXTRA=e)
> END
>
> 4) Instantiate the object with the simpler syntax:
> IDL> f = foo()
>
```

I do not see a problem, and have seen this been done. In fact, this has become unnecessary in IDL 8, as this kind of wrapper is automatically available to every class.
