Do you know if IDL is still alive? Try doing: a=dialog\_message('hello')
And see if the dialog comes up.

There was a bug in IDL 8.0, where under certain circumstances the IDL console could become disconnected from IDL, and you would no longer see any output. This has since been fixed, and will be available in the upcoming patch.

This may sound strange but yes there is a workaround for getting the console to start working properly again once it is in the disconnected state without restarting the workbench:

- 1. create an array variable, e.g. a=[1,2]
- 2. open the variables view
- 3. at the top right of the variables view is a chevron, click it and select layout -> vertical view orientation
- 4. select the array variable in the variables view, which shows the value [1,2] in the lower pane
- 5. the console should now work properly again
