Your question is too general to be answered in a forum like this.

This is a problem that is straightforward in principal, but has many technical details that need to be carried out correctly. There can be issues of stability and convergence, as with any finite-difference scheme.

Once you have a proper scheme, it is usually relatively easy to implement in IDL. You can use the SHIFT operator to compute finite differences. For implicit schemes there are tri-diagonal solvers and other matrix operators.
