This appears to be true, although the preference is a bit misleading. It says "Graphics windows stay on top". What it means is that "New graphics windows stay on top, if they are not embedded in a widget program or some other useful construction. Normal graphics windows and embedded new graphics windows disappear behind other applications and are lost for all time."

I can understand wanting the direct graphics folks to get down in steerage where they belong, but isn't taking away their WShow command like kicking them in the teeth, too. :-(
