
Subject: ENVI_BATCH_INIT refuses to run without an available X windows session

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Hi all,

I'm trying to run some programs that use ENVI commands on a high-performance linux server that doesn't run X Windows. I assumed I could do this by using the ENVI batch mode (through ENVI_BATCH_INIT), but it is complaining that it can't find an X server.

The log of my session is below:
