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I'm quite fond of Google Reader. The new Groups interface is quite similar, so I'm pretty content with it. I guess it depends on what you're comparing it to though. A good usenet client?

Concerning Android devices, the Gmail/Calendar integration is great, and I really like the maps/navigation. My problems are primarily with the hardware, in that running an application can be a risky endeavor. It might not always work, and if it does, it may be some time before you can manage to get back to an operational launcher screen again.
