> I've noticed that the z-axis label in three-dimensional function graphics often (always?) is rendered parallel to the x-y plane, rather than being oriented vertically. This isn't at all what I want, and I can't seem to fix it by setting the `text_orientation` property for the axis. As a work-around, I've been omitting the z-axis title and filling in the text with a `text()` object, which is an awful kludge. What's the right way?

Yup, this is a bug in IDL 8.2. It has been fixed in IDL 8.2.1, though, which will be released at the end of the month.
