This is going quite well, and I would like to see if it is possible to expand To this end, I am running an experiment in which I will hold a one hour demo/training/conversation with interested IDL users in how to install and use the Coyote Graphics System in IDL. This will be held on Thursday, March 13th, at 9:30 AM, Mountain Daylight Time (Denver, Colorado, USA time). This session is completely free.

The way this works is that WebEx will install a plug-in on your browser that will allow us to communicate with one another. I am told this plug-in will not interfere with firewalls, etc. (One of the things I am hoping this experiment tests, obviously.) WebEx does require a recent browser and has a few other requirements.
