You can use the EXIT routine to return an error code. Or you can pipe stdout to a variable -- though you are going to have to start IDL with -quiet, like:

\$ var=\$(idl -quiet -e "print, 5") \$ echo \$var 5

\$ var=\$(idl -quiet -e "result = fun() & print, result")

Or you could just have FUN print its output instead of returning a value. In any case, if you are doing this, make sure to remove other PRINT statements from your code.
