With dmacro, you can create a mode specific "masthead" that will be inserted into any new buffer that is created in a particular mode. DMacro also allows you to create named macros that can invoke other macros and leave a point/mark at defined locations to make it easy to "fill in the blanks". Finally, dmacro has a number of predefined macros to help with this fill-in.

To give you an idea, here is my mastheads from my dmacro file:
