I am trying to solve for the value x in an equation similar to the one below (note, integer on left-hand side of $=$ sign is not necessarily going to be 1 and $\ln$ stands for the natural log):

$$1 = (\ln(1-X))/(\ln(1+x))$$

Since I can't isolate the x , I can't take the easy way out and just define the variable like I have been doing. It has been suggested that another program might be easier or even necessary, but I just wanted to make sure that I exhausted all my possibilities with IDL before I move on.
