I am still using IDL 4 and AIX 3.2.5, but that shouldn't really matter for the following question, I suppose:

When I am opening a file with OPENR,unit,'~/IDL/DATA/test.dat',/get_lun it works fine. But if I try to find that file via PRINT,FINDFILE('~/IDL/DATA/test.dat') I get an empty string indicating that IDL did not find it.

Does anyone know how to teach IDL to accept the '~' in FINDFILE? One option might be to use SPAWN, 'echo \$HOME', result but (a) is this highly OS dependent (b) does it not work for something like ~user/file.dat Any ideas appreciated!
