Forgive me for responding to myself, but some help from RSI indicates that the HASP/floppy problem is related to Dell's approach to the external floppy connection. If Dell were to switch to a USB connection, for example, the problem goes away. I guess, but the HASP is supposed to be transparent to the other hardware. Another way to solve the problem would be to drop the HASP approach to licensing.
